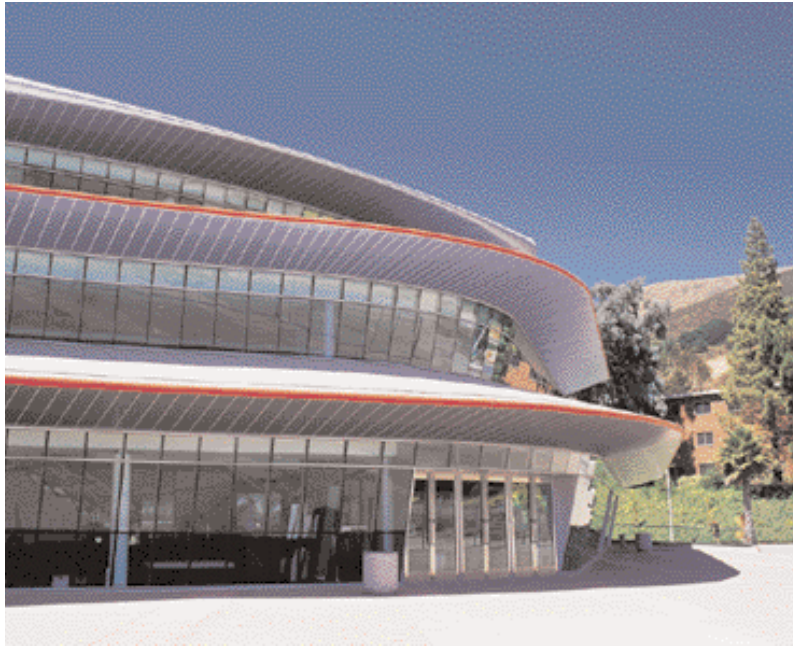
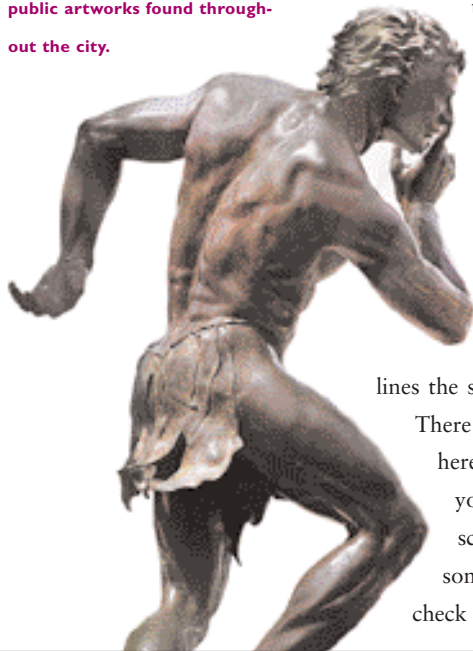


# Art&Life
